Best wishes to you all and hope life treats you real kind. Fr. Liam.


### 2024 Site Specific Sculpture Trail

### Hibernia Boat Race



In August 1905, 12 strong sailors from the USS Kearsarge, the champion cutter racing crew of the U.S. Navy's Atlantic Squadron, challenged the team from the recently established Hibernia Racing Club of Newport to a four-mile rowing race in Newport Harbor. Beginning in 1895, cutter races on the harbour attracted thousands of Newport's citizens, Navy sailors, tourists, workers and gamblers to watch these 12-man boats compete for money and prizes. The race was won by the Hibernia crew by several lengths. Six of the crew were from Sneem: Michael Casey was father of the famous Steve "Crusher" Casey and grandfather of Noel Casey. He was born in 1877 in a little parish called Loughane about 8 miles from Sneem village, he was the 3rd in a family of nine, five girls and four boys. He was very lucky in his young age in that he refused to go on a fishing trip to haul some nets where 8 men were lost . In those days there was no employment in Ireland and thousands were forced to emigrate.

Thomas and Michael Brennan were from Sneem or the area around it.

Christie Burns, James Malvey and Martin Shea were also from Sneem and David Fitzgerald came from Caherdaniel.

Noel Casey would be interested if anyone knows of any of the descendants of these men. There was a lecture given in The Museum of Newport Irish History on 20th March entitled *"The Great Cutter Race of 1905: An Irish Tale of Newport's Gilded Age"*

### **April - Let Dandelions Bee**

This month will see the biggest bloom of Dandelions. These native wildflowers are vital sources of nectar and pollen. Records sent to the National Biodiversity Data Centre in 2023 showed that Dandelions were the most popular food source for wild bees. Help feed hungry pollinators this month and #LetDandelionsBee. **Getting ready for No Mow May - Reduced mowing tips** 

Reducing mowing even to once a month can help feed our hungry pollinators. By mowing less, you are giving native wildflowers a chance to pop up naturally. Over time this will result in pockets of species-rich grassland: a vital habitat providing food and shelter for pollinators. If you're taking part in No Mow May this year and you're worried about grass growth, cut your lawn before the end of April. This will ensure the height is manageable when it's time to mow again. Make sure you remove grass clippings to help wildflowers grow.

Nesting season is upon us and we are excited awaiting the return of swifts, swallows and house martins to our village. Our two new swift boxes are located on Sneem Community Centre and Sneem Creche and we will be watching them closely to see if any swifts take up residence this summer.

House martins typically nest under the eaves on the sides of buildings and swallows inside (in barns and outhouses). House martins are having difficulty as their nests are built of mud and can fall off plastic soffits which are common these days. ### Grow Local

Laurence Vanpoulle attended the Transition Kerry Programme for Biodiversity and Climate Change through 2022, which was aimed at spreading information through the community to tackle the climate and biodiversity crises. Following up from the course, she is interviewing a number of people who grow food in our area to find out what makes them tick, how their gardens work and what inspired them to their lifestyle.

Last month we heard Paul's growing story, now let's hear some of his tips and amazing knowledge. When Laurence met Paul it was early September and he had just finished harvesting the potatoes and the young shoots of green manure were emerging from the beds, preparing the garden for the winter. Paul's favourite production is potatoes. "They are easy to grow, keep all the year, and feed the family. We always grow three maincrops: Cara, Maris Piper, and this year I tried Sarpo Mira. Of course, we have early potatoes as well."

#### What is the difference between main crop and early potatoes?

Maincrop potatoes are varieties that take longer to mature (usually 100-160 days, or 14-23 weeks), they are generally larger than early potatoes, and they keep better in storage. Cara tubers are round with white skin and pink eyes. This variety has a good taste and is suitable for all types of preparation: mashing, chips, roasting and baking. They are the one Paul grows each year and would mostly strongly recommend to others. Maris Pipers originated in Ireland, from grower John Clarke in 1963, have a golden skin and creamy white flesh with a fluffy texture. It is a versatile all-rounder, but tend to fall apart when boiled.

Paul emphasises the importance of a good soil. "We cultivate everything that thrives on this land easily and happily. Everything is grown following permaculture principals. We put food on the table according to what we have in the garden, which means you have to grow efficiently. Most vegetable production uses manure from farmed animals, but we don't as we are vegan. We rely on green manure and compost to keep the soil productive."

### Grow Local

Green manures are plants which cover and protect the soil for the winter. "Our mix contains clover or vetch, which are nitrogen fixers, and the seeds are sown in autumn after harvesting. To keep the soil covered we also use seaweed, our own compost, and we mulch with grass clippings and cardboard. A good compost and deep, raised beds are really important when you rely on green manure."

Paul's garden is organised as a succession of "rooms" separated by hedges. "They are actually edible, but mostly they provide shelter to the productive beds, protecting from the wind and from the passage of animals. Some shrubs bring nutrients to the soil the same way as green manure does - for example, the roots of Eleagnus x Ebbingei are great for nitrogen-fixing. We also have shrubs and plants for the bees, such as Berberis (Darwinii) which has orange flowers and small evergreen leaves. It blooms early which is important for the pollinators." We are now in March, look around, they are looking magnificent at the moment.

As we all know, without insects, many of the food that grows in our gardens and farms will not be pollinated, risking the production of all fruits and vegetables.
